Mountains to the Coast Insect Report
Mountains

- Tiny Black Stoneflies (Capniidae) < sz. 20
- Dolophilodes (Philopotamidae) caddisflies sz. 18-16-fish up against bank/rocks
- Males: Mottled Brown Wing
- Females: Wingless, black adults that look like pupae

Piedmont

- Lingering Neophylax caddisflies (tan-diamond-backed caddisflies) sz. 18
- Tiny Black Stoneflies (Capniidae) < sz. 20
- Needle, roll-wing stoneflies (Leuctridae) - thin bodied, brown imitations sz. 18 or 20

TN Tailwaters

- Adult midges: Olive and black in sz. 20-18
- Larval midges: Olive and grey in sz. 26-18
- Fall olives (Blue-winged olives) ending. Early winter olives beginning. Use olive-blue bodied adults.

Larvae for Mountains and Piedmont

- March brown, grey fox, Epeorus (Heptageniidae) sz. 16-20
- Blue quill (Paraleptophlebia, Leptophlebiidae) sz. 18
- Sulphurs, Hendricksons (Ephemerella, Ephemerellidae) sz. 20-18
- Golden stoneflies (Perlidae) in various sizes mostly "small" sz. 18-14 and "large" sz. 106

Coastal Plain Blackwaters (Approaching cold fronts can reduce activity, but some insect surface feeding still expected at present)

- Brown Millers (Triaenodes, Leptoceridae) sz. 18
- Light Cahills (Stenacron, Heptageniidae) sz. 18-16
- Coastal Plain October Caddis (Pycnopsyche indiana) sz. 14
- Spotted October Caddis (Pycnopsyche antica) sz. 12-10
- Various mottled and brown caddisflies (mostly Hydropsychidae of various genera) sz. 18
- Grey bizarre caddisflies (Lepidostoma, Lepidostomatidae) sz. 20
- Needle, roll-wing stoneflies (Leuctridae) - thin bodied, brown imitations sz. 18 or 20

Coastal non-game Baitfish

- Silverside and bay anchovy still pouring out of coastal rivers from NC Outer Banks to Charleston, SC
- Drawing False Albacore action at sound inlets (from Hatteras-Ocracoke Inlet south to Cape Lookout-Onslow Bay and further south to NC/SC Line
- Spot, croaker, and small whiting serving as near-shore food resources for puppy red drum, black drum, sea trout and bull reds. Enjoy!
